About Benrido Collotype Atelier

Established in 1887 Benrido, Inc. is a long-standing printing and publishing company. In 1905 Benrido began specialising in the 19th century alternative printing process known as collotype. Collotype was invented in 1855 by the French engineer Alphonse Poitevin as a method for photographic fine art printing. Photographic prints of the 19th century had poor image preservability, and over time gradually faded and discoloured. To compensate for this, various printing methods using pigments were devised, one of the established techniques among them was collotype.

As one of the few remaining producers of collotype, Benrido continues to preserve this process providing opportunities for today's artist's to collaborate with the atelier's master printers.





British photographer Michael Kenna (b.1953), known for his delicate black-and-white landscape photographs, visits Hokkaido every year and tries to capture the traces of people and invisible things remembered in each place, using snow covering the open land, fences and stakes, or unnamed trees and windbreaks as motifs.

This portfolio is a selection of seven photographs all taken in 2020, and printed in collotype for the first time for the artist, creating a unique expression with a sense of "wabi."







miho kajioka memories of future



Miho Kajioka (b.1973) creates her works based on snapshots. She carries her camera everywhere and intuitively shoots whatever she finds interesting. She creates her poetic images through her meticulous darkroom work. Kajioka considers herself more of a painter than a photographer, but her first collotype portfolio, *memories of future*, centers around the theme of "Girls" and the ephemeral and mysterious sepia image emerges as if tracing a memory.

Chieko Shiraishi SHIMAKAGE



Chieko Shiraishi's (b.1968) SHIMAKAGE is literally translated as 'Island Shadow' and this work brings together varying images taken from Japan's surrounding islands and coastal areas. These images are an old retouching technique known as 'zōkin-gake' which was previously popular amongst amateur photographers in Japan during the 1920s and 30s. As a result, the images beautifully evoke a faded memory, the landscapes appear and disappear within the image from the photographers own memory, standing as faint silhouettes against the backdrop of an obscured memory.

Fan Ho (1931–2016) was one of Hong Kong's most renowned photographers. Having moved from Shanghai to Hong Kong in 1949, he captured Hong Kong streets and people's daily lives during the 50s and 60s, amidst the city's economic transformation. Fan Ho often composed his photographs with unique geometrical compositions and textures, while creating a sense of atmosphere with the interplay of light and shadow. With the collaboration between the Fan Ho Foundation and Blue Lotus Gallery, Kyoto Benrido has created a collotype portfolio containing six of Fan Ho's signature works, with each print handmade by master printers in Benrido's atelier.

Shigeo Gochō (1946–1983) suffered from caries of the thoracic vertebrae as a child, which stopped him from growing and left him with a physical handicap that caused his back to bend. Gochō studied photography under Kiyoji Ōtsuji at Kuwasawa Design School, and after that, he continued to shoot while battling illness and published a total of three photo books during his lifetime. He died in 1983 at the age of 36. One of the main features of Gochō's work is that there are many snapshots of children. Keeping children as its main feature, this portfolio is the first collotype work of Gochō and includes one work from *Days*, four works from *Self and Others*, and one work from *Childhood Time*.







Shōji Ueda (1913–2000) was one of Japan's most prominent modernist photographers and continues to be one of the nation's most highly regarded. Working mostly in his home prefecture of Tottori, he frequently incorporated surrealist imagery into his photographs. He often worked with members of his family as subjects with the local landscape of sand dunes as a backdrop.

Benrido has selected six of Ueda's most cherished images to include in this finely printed collotype portfolio. These six pictures are seminal works from his series *Sand Dune*.



In 1997, Rinko Kawauchi (b.1972) won the Grand Prix in the photography category of the 9th Hitotsubo Exhibition. The 1998 solo exhibition of the same name, featured a series of photographs that became the forerunner of her first book, *Utatane* (2001). Many of the photographs exhibited and made during that period were never included in the book and have since not been released to the public. In this miniportfolio, Kawauchi has selected six of these works from her 1998 solo exhibition to be realized as collotype prints. The works, a starting port of Kawauchi's career, offers a glimpse of the foundations of her unique visual language.



Saul Leiter: Selected Works brings together a selection of well-known and well-loved images by American photographer Saul Leiter (1923 –2013). 



Morimura Yasumasa (b.1951), master of appropriation, offers his 1984 series of still-lifes *Barco Negro on the Table* as a collection of five collotype prints. The title of the series comes from the Portuguese folk song *Barco Negro* performed by Amalia Rodrigues, a favourite of Morimura. His interpretation includes still lifes taken on a table in his studio, where everyday objects such as tableware and clothing are elevated to a higher realm of visual sophistic ation.

Robert Doisneau Selected Works



Robert Doisneau (1922–1994) is one of France's most noted photographers. During his long career, his poetic approach to street photography recorded French everyday life in often playful and surreal images. Always charmed by his subjects, he enjoyed finding amusing juxtapositions or oddities of human nature. He photographed a vast span of people and events, often juxtaposing conformist and maverick elements in images marked by an exquisite sense of humour, by antiestablishment values, and, above all, by his deeply felt humanism. – ICP





This mini portfolio features six works from Seiichi Horiuchi's (1932– 1987) series Portraits of Musicians. The selection of collotype prints include portraits of influential musical artists, composers and conductors who's works shaped western classical music. Spanning transitions from the classical, romantic, impressionist and modernist movements, Seiichi Horiuchi's portraits of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, Ludwig van Beethoven, Erik Satie, Joseph-Maurice Ravel, Igor Stravinsky and Darius Milhaud are have been faithfully reproduced in colour as collotype prints. Included is a special text created for this portfolio by poet Shuntarō Tanikawa.



Issei Suda (1940–2019) began his career in 1967 as a stage photographer and documentarist of the avant-garde theatre group Tenjō Sajiki, a theatrical troupe directed by poet-playwright Terayama Shūji, later working as a freelance photographer in 1971. His works capture a subtle tension between the ordinary and extraordinary, embodying a sense of mystery in his depictions of the unusual in everyday life. For this special edition of collotype prints, six images were selected in collaboration with Issei Suda's wife Yoshiko Suda from his series *Minyō Sanga* and *Monogusa Shūi*.

Masahisa Fukase's (1934–2012) Raven Scenes was taken with 35mm colour positive film in Kanazawa, Japan in 1977-1978. Originally titled Karasu-kei (Landscape with Ravens), the series was published in the June issue of Camera Mainichi, 1978 under the title Ravens 4. With the full support of the Masahisa Fukase Archives, Benrido has made the first ever edition prints from Fukase's Raven Scenes. The works include 8 images which have been printed in a limited edition of 5 prints each.

In 1962, Fukase was commissioned by Camera Mainichi magazine to illustrate the opening pages with a series of colour images. He set about the task enthusiastically, producing numerous photomontages in differing tonalities. The images in this series were originally conceived for publication and remained as positive films. More than half a century later, the original films had deteriorated and their colours have faded. Benrido has made the first-ever edition prints from the series Color Approach.

Kenro Izu (b. 1949) created his BLUE series as an homage to Spanish painter Pablo Picasso's works from the Blue Period (1901–1904).

Izu has developed a distinct reputation as one of the best Platinum/ Palladium print-makers in the world. He printed the series by cyanotype over platinum prints, but he was only able to produce a very limited number of editions. With Benrido, the series has been revisited with the depth of the colour blue and fine tonal gradations created through the collotype process, presenting a new layer to experiencing lzu's meditative and serene compositions.







Hiroshi Masaki (b.1949) is a rare book dealer by trade who keenly understands the underlying complexities and contradictions of Japanese culture. For years his presence has served as a bridge between photographers in Japan and the eyes of the rest of the world. His photographs illustrate Japanese cities and towns with shadows and light, often devoid of their inhabitants. His popular 2012 release *Uwajima*, a *Private Landscape* is a collection of meditative images of his hometown, elegant in their reserved beauty.
